He was ordained to pastoral ministry in 1968 after completing an undergraduate degree at Union College in Lincoln, Nebraska, and a master's at Andrews University, in Berrien Springs, Michigan. He began his ministry in Louisiana and served as a pastor and administrator in 10 U.S. states, including Minnesota, Oklahoma, Oregon, Nebraska, Wyoming, New Jersey, Louisiana, Colorado, California, and Michigan, before becoming president of the Lake Union Conference for six years.

Seminar Speakers:

Ganoune Diop is the director for the five Seventh-day Adventist Church global study centers, established by the office of Adventist Mission with the intent of understanding and interacting with other world faiths. Raised in a multicultural, predominantly Muslim setting in Senegal, he became a professional flautist, an academic and a multilinguist. His extensive education includes a master's in philology, a doctorate in Old Testament studies and another in New Testament studies on the way. He also serves as a liaison between the centers and the church's administration, including the 13 world divisions and the church's Biblical Research Institute.

Dave Fiedler currently lives in Wichita, Kansas, with his wife, Clarissa, and their daughter, Tifona. He has taught elementary, secondary, and collegiate classes in various Seventh-day Adventist schools. His book, *Hindsight: Seventh-day Adventist History in Essays and Extracts*, came from his appreciation for the lessons of our denominational history, and is much more interesting than the title makes it sound. Since August 2008, he and his family have been working to put those lessons to work in a practical way by establishing Adventist City Missions, Inc.--a metropolitan evangelistic project that includes a vegan restaurant, a health food store, an outpost-based team of colporteurs and Bible workers, a rural wellness center, and an active inner-city medical missionary work.

Ernestine Finley became a Seventh-day Adventist as the result of a literature evangelist selling truth-filled literature door to door. She attended Portland Junior Academy and later attended Atlantic Union College. Her first assignment in Seventh-day Adventist church work was as a teacher in Hartford, Connecticut. With her evangelistic husband Mark, she has ministered around the world. Together they have conducted over 100 evangelistic series on almost every continent. She conducted evangelism training seminars, health expos and cooking classes across the world. Finley has been sharing her down-to-earth approach to nutrition for over 30 years, and has authored two nutrition books: *Lifestyle 2000* and *Natural Lifestyle Cooking*, and co-authored a lay training manual *Light Your World for God*.

C. Raymond Holmes is a graduate of Northern Michigan University, the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago, and Andrews University. After serving 10 years as a Lutheran Minister, he became a Seventh-day Adventist in 1971 and has served the church as pastor, missionary, seminary professor, and author. Among his books are *Stranger in My Home, Baptized But Buried Alive, Sing A New Song, The Last Word, and The Tip of the Iceberg*. He is one of the founders of Adventist Affirm and the Adventist Theological Society, and serves on the editorial board of the *Journal of the Adventist Theological Society*. He lives with his wife Shirley in Michigan's beautiful Upper Peninsula where, in his retirement, he serves as the senior pastor of Christ Community Church of Seventh-day Adventists in Bessemer, Michigan.

Mark Howard realized early on that Christianity does not come by association, but rather, that it must be by personal choice and surrender. For nearly 15 years Pastor Howard ran from the Lord; yet the Lord in His great mercy did not cease pursuing. Through a powerful chain of events, he finally yielded his heart to Jesus and to the call to the gospel ministry. He currently pastors in Michigan with his lovely wife, Stephanie and their two children: Caleb and Annie.

Chelsy Jourdan has been an active participant and supporter of GYC since its beginning. Chelsy was born and raised in a Christian Seventh-day Adventist home in northern Minnesota. After attending Union College in Lincoln, Nebraska for one year, she felt the calling of God upon her heart to commit her life to full time gospel work. In June 2005 she started her endeavor with ASI Youth for Jesus and just a few months later attended Amazing Facts College of Evangelism. Since that turning point in her life, Chelsy has been immersed in the Lord's work by doing Bible Work, coordinating evangelistic efforts, preaching, training churches, deaning, and much more. She currently serves as GYC's Evangelism Vice President and field coordinator.

Justin Kim is the pastor of Oakwood Seventh-day Adventist Church in Michigan. He also serves as the volunteer program director of the Missionary Training Program, a part of the Center for Adventist Ministry to Public University Students. He is a graduate of Brandeis University in Boston, MA, where he started his educational career in Sociology and Biology. Since his undergraduate studies, he has received a Masters in Theology from Andrews University. One of the co-founders of GYC, he continues to serve as General Vice President for GYC.

Don Mackintosh is the director of the Amazing Facts College of Evangelism. His many experiences as a registered nurse and pastor give practical application to the teaching of scripture. He has written a fresh series of studies on Daniel & Revelation and the Sanctuary. He has also produced "What's The Connection?", a series of studies designed to lead people who attend health events to a study of Scripture. Young people find his teaching to be dynamic, insightful, and especially applicable to reaching today's culture.

Wes Peppers serves as the Outreach Coordinator at the Amazing Facts Center of Evangelism. He became a Seventh-day Adventist Christian at the age of 22 after being an atheist/agnostic for several years. Soon after accepting Christ, quitting college football and a life of reckless living, he entered into full time ministry. He has preached numerous evangelistic campaigns in the United States, Europe, and Central & South America. As a recent cancer survivor at age 28, his greatest passion is to lead others to Christ and help them have a deeper, intimate relationship with Him.

Samuel Koranteng-Pipim is currently the Director of CAMPUS (Center of Adventist Ministry to Public University Students). Trained in engineering and systematic theology, he also lectures in courses on Christian ethics and theology on several university campuses around the world. A provocative author and well-known speaker, Dr. Pipim has developed a reputation for his bold messages and commitment to the ultimate authority of God's Word. His just-released book, *Not for Sale*, deals with integrity in a culture of silence.

Paul Ratsara is the President of the Southern Africa-Indian Ocean Division of Seventh-day Adventists. Most importantly though, Elder Ratsara is a man of God. Under his Spirit-filled leadership, God has blessed the division with tremendous growth (-the most recent statistics indicate that over 2 million Seventh-day Adventists worship in the region). Elder Ratsara's greatest desire is to see an evangelism "explosion" take place all over the world.

Nathan Renner is the senior pastor of the Sonora, California SDA church and the associate director of ARISE. His frequent speaking appointments have carried him the world over. He was called to ministry shortly after his conversion in January of 1997. He worked as a Bible worker and evangelist prior to the call to pastoral ministry. At ARISE, Pastor Renner teaches classes on Romans, Bible Boot Camp, and Evangelism. His passion is the local church and seeing it become all God intended it to be. He is married to Becky and they have two very special young children, Levi and Laurel. Pastor Renner enjoys the outdoors, rock climbing, and fly fishing.

Eric Walsh is a graduate of Oakwood College, the University of Miami School of Medicine, and Loma Linda University School of Public Health. He is currently completing his Dr. PH in Global Health at LLU SPH. He is currently the medical director of the East Campus Urgent Care at Loma Linda University. Dr. Walsh also serves as the Assoc. Pastor at the 16th St. SDA church in San Bernardino, California. Dr. Walsh is very involved in international missions. Above all he seeks to spread the gospel through the preaching & healing ministries.

Subodh Pandit MD born and brought up in India, is a licensed, Board Certified physician from North Carolina. His twenty-year search for a reason to believe led him through the questions of atheism, post-modernism and pluralism onto a unique method of comparing the five great world religions. Previously he was Dean of the School of Religion and Professor of Theology and Ministry at Southern Adventist University where some 160 theology majors have led over 4,800 souls to baptism in the last five years. In addition to administrative responsibilities, he has taught graduate and undergraduate courses in ministry, preaching, prophetic guidance, evangelism, the Gospels, and Christian spirituality. Dr. Clouzet is married to Lisa Quam Clouzet, who has worked as a hospital chaplain and a licensed counselor. The Clouzet's have three children, Christoffer, Alex, and Stefani.

Brian McMahon has been involved in public evangelism for 18 years and has held over 70 full evangelism seminars. Having a Catholic background, Brian is known for preaching with conviction, sincerity, clarity, and compassion. He is currently the Director/Speaker of *The Evangelism Center*, which in addition to holding evangelistic seminars, focuses on the training, equipping & scheduling of evangelists, pastors and lay people. David Williams received his Doctorate in Sociology from the University of Michigan in 1986, and has since then taught at Yale, the University of Michigan, and Harvard (where he currently serves as Professor of African and African American Studies and Sociology). Designated as one of the Top Ten Most Cited researchers in the Social Sciences in the past decade (1994-2004), Williams has done extensive research on various issues related to ethnicity and social inequality.

Clifford Goldstein is a leading theologian in the Seventh-day Adventist church, Clifford Goldstein is best known for his contributions to Adventist apologetics and has authored 18 books, including *God, Godel, and Grace*, *Graffiti in the Holy of Holies*, and *1844 Made Simple*. Since 1999, he has also worked as the editor of the Adult Sabbath School Ministries Quarterly. In the past, Goldstein has served as the editor for Shabbat Shalom magazine (1983-1993) and Liberty magazine (1993-1999) and as Associate Director of the Department of Public Affairs and Religious Liberty of the North American Division of Seventh-day Adventists (1992-1993). Originally from Albany, New York, he received his M.A. in Ancient Semitic Languages from Johns Hopkins University in 1992 and now lives with his wife Kimberly and their two children in Maryland.

Nicole Parker is a graduate of Ouachita Hills Academy, and formerly served as a colporteur leader, English teacher, and girls' dean. She is currently raising three very entertaining children, ages six, four, and two, and finishing her Master's in Biblical Counseling from Trinity Seminary. She is married to Alan Parker and currently resides in Tennessee (where he teaches at Southern Adventist University).

Janice Watson is the Associate Professor of Communication at Oakwood University. Previously, she was the Associate Professor of Communication and Coordinator of the department's M.A. in Interdisciplinary Studies at Andrews University. She holds degrees in English and Teaching English as a Second Language as well as in Communication. She earned her M.A. from Andrews University and her Doctorate in Intercultural Communication at the University of Minnesota. She enjoys teaching classes in rhetoric and public address, intercultural communication, conflict argumentation and debate and communicant research methodology. She has served as an intercultural consultant and trainer for organizations in Europe and in the United States. She likes reading, swimming, and traveling, but dislikes the vegetable okra and early morning classes. Watson is also a board member of GYC (Generation of Youth for Christ).

Amy Lee Sheppard is a second-year law student at the University of Virginia.
